Playa Arrival Process

Get to the Playa SAFE!! Obey Traffic Signs & Speed Limits!!

If I have NOT CONTACTED YOU ALREADY ABOUT EARLY ARRIVAL...PLEASE PLAN TO ARRIVE AFTER 12:01 am on Sunday, August 25 aka post-midnight Saturday - The officially opening of Burning Man 2024!! You will not be able to gain entrance to Burning Man prior to that time. Have fun at the gate and with Greeters Station...Rub Playa all over your arms, do a Playa-Angel. Once you make your way past the greeter's head towards PolyParadise.

If you arrive after Dark...There is not much you can really setup in the dark effectively, so take the time to relax and wait until daybreak. If you arrive after dark, BE CAREFUL as you drive around the Playa and within our camp.

Find **Scotto** - All campers will be placed as you arrive according to what vehicles and infrastructure you have. All requests will be accommodated if possible.

The Camp is **ONE BIG PUZZLE**. We have a full camp; we will need to be IN **TIGHT**, so proper placement of Guide wires and stakes is **CRUCIAL**! If I feel your setup needs adjustment I will ask and be willing to help. My decisions are always for the maximum good for ALL!!

DO NOT start to setup your stuff until you SEE Scotto!!! If Scotto is not available there will be someone in camp that can assist you, just ask. If you setup your stuff without our knowledge you may be asked to move because the plan is being formulated as the Plan Happens.

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** PolyParadise is Turning 26 YRS OLD **

Welcome to Burning Man 2024 - The 26th Birthday Party of PolyParadise; it is hard to believe that this Theme Camp started in 1999 with 8 campers has blossomed into a thriving 300-person village. My first year was 2000; we had 15 campers – my how we have grown not just in number of campers but as a group of International Burners spanning the globe. I know I have grown over the past 25-years as a person – a Burner and as a leader – The Benevolent Dictator of The Village of PolyParadise. I have witnessed many changes within our diverse culture of Burners and within our own camp as the number of campers has increased.

So many people have come and gone and passed thru the Camp/Village over the past 25 years and each attendee has different reasons for attending Burning Man – returning year after year or coming to Black Rock City as a Virgin Burner. We were all Virgins to Burning Man at one time – we all thought we knew why we went the first time – have you taken a look recently why you are making the trek to BRC?

Post Burning Man 2018 I had a few things to say about what the Burn means to me and how being an event producer of the Village of PolyParadise had affected me. If you had not read my FB Posts you can do so here: [I am a Big-Deal](#) – [Setting the Record STR8](#). No matter what I said or how I said it – what words I chose – it is important to know that not only do I care about the future of Burning Man - I care about the Village of PolyParadise & I care about YOU and the experience you have within the gates of Black Rock City and within the boundaries of the Village of PolyParadise.

For the past 25 years the only stated RULE or Code of Conduct of the camp has been: PolyParadise is NOT a Swinger Camp. Being Poly or Practicing Poly is NOT a requirement for camping with us, but being OPEN MINDED about other people's lifestyle choices IS!! As we embark on our 26th year within the gates of Black Rock City – as Benevolent Dictator I feel it is time to add a few more items for our campers to consider.

If Burning Man & Black Rock City is in-fact a Utopia – then that vision of Utopia must represent each of us and our distinct reasons for making the Black Rock Desert and The Village of PolyParadise our home each August. This utopia must be a space in which each of us feels safe; with the knowledge that our ability to consent is paramount and is respected by all.

One of the [Ten Principles](#) is Radical Self-Expression (Radical Self-Expression arises from the unique gifts of the individual. No one other than the individual or a collaborating group can determine its content. It is offered as a gift to others. In this spirit, the giver should respect the rights and liberties of the recipient.)

Your own Radical Self-Expression (whatever that may be) is to be respected right up to the line where it might infringe on how someone else defines their own Radical Self-Expression. In that vein, Consent should not just be considered in a sexual reference – Consent is about each of us being able to choose when our boundaries are pushed. No one should be forced to view something or participate in an activity in the name of someone else's Radical Self-Expression. None of us really knows what our boundaries are or what hot buttons lie under the surface are until they are pushed - but the choice to confront those issues should be with the individual to push or pursue.

The Village of PolyParadise strives to be a sex-positive space; (having positive attitudes about sex and feeling comfortable with one's own sexual identity and with the sexual behaviors of others); but being sex-positive does not mean that we are a sex-oriented camp. Yes, our campers have sex, yes, our campers engage in diverse sexual activities; all of which are respected. With that said the camp will no longer be providing a dedicated space to sexual activity (Perfect Place For Poly Play). This 28' dome with its intended purpose was highly underutilized for many years; meaning that most campers used their own RV, Tent, Yurt, structure or made their way to other camps within BRC to have the sexual experiences they desired.

Consent is paramount - Always ask before touching someone. Vocalize consent for every social and physical interaction. Don't assume consent for one activity automatically means consent for any others. Be firm with your boundaries. Be careful not to leer or be a voyeur to the activities of others. Be mindful of your body and presence always. Be vigilant of how you affect others with words and actions.

We practice affirmative, enthusiastic consent. This means that if there is a hint of hesitation or doubt in the "yes" you receive, it is a "no." Please let The Benevolent Dictator, Camp Mom or other camp leaders know if a fellow camper makes you uncomfortable, for any reason, or talk with them yourself.

It should not be assumed that everyone that camps with The Village of PolyParadise wears a Polyamorous label in their life (~40%) or is there to be sexually adventurous. A large majority that camp with us do so because of our Kick-Ass kitchen and shared meal plan; the public events we host or friends that camp within our borders. The populous of the Village should not by default be thought of as potential candidates for the sexual adventurism you might want to engage in. Keep that in mind in how you approach each other for such activities.

Are you bringing Art or an interactive project or planning an activity within the camp? Is the idea to share something you enjoy with others or is the idea to push boundaries in the name of just pushing boundaries? Think about how your project will be perceived by other campers; just because you find it morally justified others may not see it in the same light. Remember that we all come to Burning Man & Black Rock City for a variety of reasons; your art, project, activity should be thought of with this in mind. We are not attempting to limit your creativity, your ideas or activities; what we ask is that if your project or idea might be considered non-mainstream by others; putting it behind a curtain or within a structure allows our campers to have a choice of seeing or participating. We are not saying that your idea, project or activity is not welcome but in the name of consent; campers should not have to avert their eyes, walk a different way or avoid what they might deem outside their bounds just so you can be Radically Expressive.

Our Kitchen - Community & Event spaces should be considered R-Rated (Nudity is acceptable - If you have a 'Bare Bottom' you are asked to have a towel or some covering for the chair you will plop your bare bottom on....THANK YOU) - any Adult Activity that you would not see in any public place should be taken inside your own RV, Tent, Yurt, structure or make your way to other camps within Black Rock City to engage in such adult experiences.

Just to recap - There are no specific events, activities or art projects that are being banned within the boundaries of The Village of PolyParadise - We are asking that each camper think about their actions and how they affect others - Just because you want to - just because you can - does not mean that you should. We only ask that you think about how any event, activity, art project will be perceived by others - is the Radical-Expression you wish to pursue going to trample the rights of others?

Things to Think About & Other Tidbits

We are a group of Polyamorists and Poly-Friendly Burners seeking to live our dreams, and this camp is one manifestation of that. Polyamory involves openness to multiple loving relationships, with honesty among all partners.

We all come to BM and PolyParadise from our own communities and our own households, each with a different set of rules or understandings / agreements between the different people and groups of people who accompanied us to BM.

Burning Man is a society where customs are quite different than the default world. But this does not mean that it is a 'free for all'. The personal limits of others can easily be pushed or disregarded.

Please do not make any assumptions that because a person of either gender is naked that they want 'Touch', in our camp as well as your ventures on the Playa. As Poly's we 'Process' in our own ways...Touching without asking or without having prior permission to do so is unacceptable in PolyParadise.

For Those That Choose to Be Naked

Nude is not Lewd. It's not even illegal on federal land, which the playa is. Mere nudity is not considered sexual. However, **sitting your naked butt down on a common chair without putting a towel or something down first is considered – well, at least crass.** Nude can be rude. At most nudist resorts you are expected to sit on your own towel or cloth when using common sitting accommodations. We at PolyParadise would also appreciate the same courtesy.

Camp Guests

You will be responsible for any and all actions of ANY guest that you bring into our Camp.

Coolers & Ice on the Playa

There will be a designated area at the back of the kitchen where you can store your personal cooler or you can store it in your tent. **YOU MUST COME TO THE PLAYA WITH ICE IN YOUR COOLER – YOU MUST KEEP THE CONTENTS OF YOUR COOLER ICED!!** Any cooler in the kitchen area will be inspected by the Nevada Health Department; any cooler contents that are not properly ICED will have its contents disposed of.

Cooler water that is NOT TAINTEED should be drained in an available 5-gallon bucket for use as dishwashing water.

Village of PolyParadise Playa Events

If you are in the Kitchen area while an event is in progress; be courteous of the noise levels. The facilitators of the events have enough outside distractions to deal with; they shouldn't have to deal with loud campmates.

Handling Disputes

There is always the possibility that disputes will happen in camp, about this or that. Please try and work things out amongst yourselves. If the problem cannot be resolved, please **contact Scotty or Trevor before getting Rangers or Law Enforcement Officer (LEO) involved.**

The Definition of Community is Participation

The camp fee is the cost of new gear purchased, getting all of the camps infrastructure to the playa and maintaining that gear year-long off playa. The Construction and destruction of the camp takes ALL of us.

Teardown – Monday September 2nd

MONDAY is a BLITZKRIEG of work. It is not my desire to start to dismantle part of the camp on Sunday, to make the work on Monday any lighter. Though if you are leaving after Temple Burn; The Carcass Wash structure can be taken down after the event ends @ 5p. Come and find me as we gather all of the tools necessary and Take it Down Together.

We are appreciative of those that are able to stay Monday, being available to help in the **MASSIVE** effort it takes to **PACK IT ALL OUT!!!** The Takedown will start @ Sunrise. The Shower & Kitchen are the first things to come down/get packed up. There is a method to the madness.

As our shade dwindles – we will provide lunch (Deli meat wraps & other leftovers). Then the next push to be able to have the two trucks packed by sunset.

Speaking of Exodus

Make sure you are giving yourself enough time to make Flights or Rental Returns. Many Burners will have the same idea as you to leave after The Man or Temple Burn. Even leaving Monday morning be prepared for very long wait times to exodus. It may be several hours to even get to pavement, then slow going the 88 miles to Route 80.

[Burning Man Information Radio \(94.5 FM\)](#) is your nexus for essential information on the playa. Especially concerning the state of the line to exit and expected wait times.

There will be ~30 campers staying Monday night; by Tuesday you should be well on your way home Hippie!

Where do I put my Keys & ID? It would really suck if you lost the keys to your vehicle. I am sure there are locksmith services available but presume it will be quite expensive. Do not carry your keys around the Playa with you. Place them in a safe & secure place within your belongings. If you use them to access your vehicle, make sure you return them to that same spot immediately after use.

Wherever it is that you put your keys place your ID there too. If for any reason, you get stopped and asked for your ID, you know that when you produce your ID your stash will not fall out for LEO to see. Speaking Of LEO...

Burning Man & LEO (Law Enforcement Officer): Burning Man takes place within the state of Nevada and within the borders of the US. That means that all applicable laws concerning illegal substances apply when inside the gates of BRC. **Be SMART!** The [Burning Man Survival Guide](#) has excellent information concerning your rights when dealing with LEO. Make sure to read and heed the warnings.

If you are a partaker of illicit substances, bring them with you, do not attempt to purchase On-Playa. Only share with those you know. Be aware of your surroundings when you are involved in this activity. Leo has sophisticated equipment to find you doing something illegal, do not give them that chance.

Marijuana – Medical – Recreational – Nevada – BRC

Mary Jane – Pot – Marijuana may be **Medically Legal** in your hometown – **WEED** may be **Recreationally** available in your state as it is in **Nevada**. **TAKE NOTE THAT BURNING MAN TAKES PLACE ON FEDERAL LAND** – That means that your Medical Marijuana Card **MEANS NOTHING TO BLM OR FEDERAL COPS**. **DO NOT** consume Marijuana products in your vehicle while on the way to Black Rock City; **SMELL** is probable cause for further investigation. **Do not put your STASH with your ID or Keys** – Do not start to consume Marijuana products until you get to camp, and your car is parked. The Fine is ~\$1,500 for Marijuana related offenses.

Community Kitchen Donations

If you bring a large can of Garbanzo Beans, Large Squash or other perishables or large can goods, you must have a plan to cook and share it, otherwise be prepared to take it back home with you. All food and colored liquids must be properly labeled and somewhat recognizable.

Check your gear before you leave: particularly tents. No matter how many times you've used it. No matter how positive you are that all the pieces are there. Open that puppy up and check it.

Camp Power

The Community Space/Kitchen will have power 24/7. There will be a designated area in the Community Space set up for charging batteries. Power will be available in the kitchen for appliances; (2) Commercial 1-Drip 2-Warm coffee maker; Rice Cooker. The Community Space will be lit up at night with lots & lots of lights as well as a very illuminated kitchen. The Event Space is a UV-Light extravaganza with stereoscopic glasses.

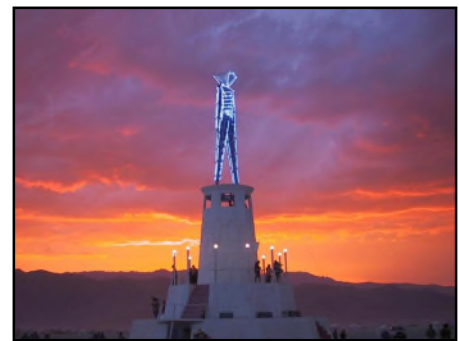
The generator is for the Kitchen & Community space. It is not available to provide power to your individual camp locations. The sink & shower are hooked to a Battery backup; so, in the event the generator is off (resting or being refilled with gas) there will be power supplied for the wastewater from the kitchen sink & shower will still be pumped to the Grey Water tank. **We do not provide Electrons to charge Power Chairs or CPAP devices.**

Things not to bring: Plants, living or dead, and anything that will break up and/or blow away in the wind (plants, trees, twigs, loose paper, palm fronds, etc.), Feathers of any kind, e.g. Boas, Glass containers, Excess packaging from foods (remove outer box just bring the inner bag), Loose glitter, Nuts in their shells, Styrofoam coolers, Straw or hay bales, Explosives, aerial flares, rockets, Firearms of any kind, Camp Chairs with foot rest attached.

Playa Time: Playa Time begins the moment you start to pack. Things take longer while in Playa Time. Get to the Playa SAFE!! Obey traffic signs & Speed Limits!! The Playa & PolyParadise will be there when you get there.

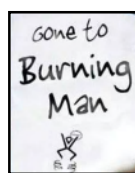

Community Kitchen

Kitchen & Community Meals

The Kitchen and all its contents (Except Marked Coolers) will be available for all PolyParadise campers to use and consume. Please be respectful in cleaning up after yourself after using the Kitchen. Wash any and all utensils, pots, spills in a reasonable amount of time after you have prepared any food. Within 3 hours is an acceptable time frame...

There will be a Dish Washing & Rinsing Station available...Please use it!!! If you use a LARGE Pot to prepare your meal, you are responsible for cleaning said Pot.

Camp Resident Responsibilities

Individual Water Bottles – Please do not be that camper that leaves half empty water bottles around PolyParadise. If you are drinking a bottle of water, and leave it there, do you honestly expect someone else to come along and drink it? Do you honestly expect someone else to come along and pick up after you? Apparently!! Nobody wants your half-used bottle of water. Either finish it or dispose of it. If you intend to come back to it, write your name on it. Get them to the recycle bin empty. **FINISH IT OR DISPOSE OF IT**

DeMoop - Please DE-MOOP your camp food contributions before coming to the playa. Do not bring the Cardboard Box just the food portion.

Waste - Do not bring a giant size jar/can of anything, unless you have some idea of how it is going to be used. A 10lb can of chickpeas might be a bargain, but **NO ONE** likes them that much, and once opened, if it is not used by the end of the week it becomes trash and could end up in the trash bag assigned to YOU. The less trash we all generate; the lighter will be your bag at the end of the week. **PAY ATTENTION** to the signs that say **RECYCLABLE, BURNABLE, TRASH, GLASS.**

Special Food Mention - Watermelons do not do well in the heat. If left out for one day the insides cook and become inedible. If you are bringing a watermelon, leave the rind at home. Cut up the melon – use a seal-a-meal. Then you can eat or serve them when you like. Melon pieces can also be whipped up into a smoothie; we have a blender available.

Pretty much the same goes for any kind of melon (Cantaloupes, Honeydews) and fruit without a hard skin (bananas, kiwi). Apples seem to last fairly well. Dried fruit works great.

If you have special dietary requirements, you should take it upon yourself to provide accordingly. Do not presume that what other people contribute will conform to your dietary needs.

Community Space Edict - PolyParadise is a very free and accepting community. We ask that sexual activity or clearly X-Rated behavior not take place in the open community or event space. There may be minors not miners in the camp, and though they may have been raised in an open environment at home; those behaviors are just not welcome in our Public Spaces. Please confine clearly adult activity or any sexual activity to your own private accommodations and not in the Community / Event spaces.

What Other Camp Contributions Do I Still Need To Bring?

- **5 Gallons of Water/ Vehicle** - to contribute to the running of the Human Carcass Wash / Community Drinking water. If you can bring more water that would be greatly appreciated.
- Participate in Daily Community Meal - (Eating, Cooking, Serving or Washing Dishes)
- Place your donated water in the Community space near the Orange Water Jug.

Each camp member is expected to take some Community Trash home & dispose of it in the proper manner in an appropriate facility or container. Plan to donate at least **2 hours** of your time before you leave the Playa to cleanup of the PolyParadise site as well as the general state of BRC.

- Be present and do the work for your randomly assigned shift/task on whatever day you are assigned.

Consent in Black Rock City

Burning Man is committed to making our city safe. We are family in Black Rock City and we always need to take care of our own. If someone needs a hand, we give it. If someone is getting a little out there, we steer them towards safety. And if someone is sharing themselves in a way that makes someone else uncomfortable, we let that sharer know it's about time to back off and go someplace else. Yes, means yes, and no means no, maybe means no, drunk does not mean yes, and neither does naked nor altered. So, if you see someone being treated any way but wonderfully, step on in and be an advocate. Please read the consent flyer in your Greeter packet.

The [Bureau of Erotic Discourse \(B.E.D.\)](#) is a committed group of participants who promote positive change in the Burning Man community using posters, workshops, outreach and dialog on consent, sex and sexual assault prevention. Emergency Services (ESD) is also here to help, offering medical professionals as well as an experienced group of mental health professionals called the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT).

PolyParadise is a Global Presence

Over our **26yrs** we are proud to have hosted campers from **34 Global Communities** (Australia, Belize, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, England, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, Hungary, India, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Indonesia, Japan, Latvia, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealand, Poland, Romania, Russia, Singapore, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, Vietnam)

Village Resident Tags

Village of PolyParadise Resident Name Tags - There will be a box in the Community Space containing the PolyParadise Resident Name Tags; please make sure to get yours.

On the **FRONT** of your tag is a 'Symbol' and on the **BACK** on the Tag is a 'Symbol' - There are **Six (6)** different Symbols **Front & Back**. Use these Symbols to **'Mix & Match'** conversations; get to know one another. It would be a random occurrence in making the tags that you would match both symbols. **Break The Ice or Playa Dust** whichever you prefer.

Hand-Washing Stations

The time has come for an **UPGRADE** to our Hand-Washing Stations (Kitchen & Serving Line).

To make it all easier in transport & setup we are investing in self-contained Hand-Washing Stations.

They will be operated by a Foot Pump and have available Soap & Hand Towels.

There will be (3) Three in the Kitchen for use by those cooking and (1) One in the serving line; so, you can clean your hands prior to getting in the food serving line.



Volunteeratoldism™

Communities thrive by Participation; no wonder it is one of Burning Man's Ten Principles. Your own share of the entirety of the workload as a camp member may come as a Lead, Volunteer or being Voluntold to any specific task. Having a vested interest in the success of said community creates pride & satisfaction.

Due to factors that are irrelevant to this consciousness of thought several of our long-time leads (Kitchen Management, Garbage, LNT, Ice) have either stepped away from Burning Man and or their role as a lead. We are now @ a cross-roads to forge a new direction as we celebrate 26yrs in BRC.

Forward-looking thinking requires bold moves – it requires creating a unique word "**Volunteeratoldism**"™ and design a new paradigm. This new model will ensure that each day's tasks are being attended to and everyone shares in the over-all effort it takes to create & maintain a community as large and as diverse as ours all week long. Adding an "ism" to a word indicates that the word represents a specific practice, system, or philosophy. That is exactly what we are creating a new way that the camp as a whole will be managed and operated.

During the registration process you were told that you would be randomly assigned a task; with several campers for each task/day the idea is that this new model will allow all the things each day get done – with many hands makes light work.

The randomly assigned tasks will center around Managing the Kitchen/Meal, Daily Ice Run, Managing and distribution of garbage, Leave No Trace. The schedule & detailed instructions will be printed on large poster board.

If you as an individual camper do your part on your assigned task/shift with other campers on your assigned task/shift, then all things will get done each day! Our success as a camp this year & moving forward is in the hands of all of you.

RV's & Generators

If you are bringing your personal [RV](#) to the Playa and it has a Generator – We **STRONGLY** suggest that Pre-Playa you get the generator serviced so that it is proper working order. If at all possible, create an [Exhaust Vent](#) that blows UP and over the RV instead of directly at the tent next to you. Please also consider a noise dampening system for your generator.

If you are renting an [RV](#) and you plan to use the generator, make sure that you know ahead of time how many hours are included with your rental agreement and what the costs are per/hour after that amount has been exceeded. Remember generators require gasoline. Do not transport gasoline inside your vehicle or RV. Spilling gas will render that space permeated with an obnoxious smell for days and can ruin food. Transport gas in approved containers. Store gasoline with caution & respect as the flammable liquid it is. You must bring a container to store your gas containers – [Please see the acceptable containers for Gasoline](#).

Some of you on this message have already gotten in our camps Pre-Paid RV Pump Out Vouchers. If you have already paid for a slot please do not look to acquire another; we only have so many slots available and would love to make sure as many RV'ers have an opportunity.

We are Pre-Paying for 30 Vouchers \$100/each for Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. There are a few slots available for Wednesday & Friday. These are available on a First-Come First-Serve basis. The current list <https://tinyurl.com/2tzduu6p>

Water Fill – As a camp we have **NOT PRE-PAID for Water Refill** – The overall bill with Gray Water is **\$7,680** – so I wanted to let you know that this is info from **United Site Services**. So if you want/need water fills you are on your own to navigate that process.

****IMPORTANT Changes for 2024:**

We will no longer offer pre-sale vouchers for flag downs of any kind, flag down service is cash only.

- 1. Flag down service is not recommended because we cannot guaranty it will be offered.**
- RV Water fill vouchers will only be sold to camps with 20 or more RV's – additional vendors can be found here: <https://burningman.org/event/participate/camps/so-you-want-to-camp-at-burning-man/deliveries/outside-services-providers/>
- 3. We will no longer offer flag down RV water fill service of any kind. Pre-scheduled fills only.**

Gasoline & Gas Storage – if you bring 5G gas containers for your RV or personal generator; these gas containers will need to be **Labeled with YOUR NAME & STORED within these two fuel containment areas**. If you need to FILL your RV or personal generator you will need to go to the fuel containment area - transport that gas can to your RV/Generator & fill said engine and then **RETURN** the gas can back to the fuel containment area; even EMPTY gas cans must be returned to the fuel containment area. If a gas can is found left next to or near your RV or living space aka **NOT RETURNED** to the fuel containment area it will be confiscated and be used as camp gas for the camps generator consumption. I am **DONE** being hassled by Earth Guardians/BLM on their visits about random gas containers not being 10' away from an RV or living space; aka moving those containers away from said RV/Living spaces when they visit - having those campers move them back to where they were being housed and then having another visit from Earth Guardians/BLM and being re-hassled for the same issue.

Hydration

Drink Water! Drink Water! Drink Water! Drink Water!

No... I did not say drink a Beer, Wine Cooler, cup of Coffee, Iced Tea...I said...Drink Water!

Maintaining enough fluid in your body is probably the single most important thing that must be done! The Black Rock Desert is a very harsh environment. Most if not all of you (other than our Arizona contingent) do not live in a desert and are not used to the full sun & heat all day. Please pay attention to your body, when it says it is time have water, drink water, when it says it is time to rest, please rest...

Watch for the warning signs of non-sufficient hydration:

Lack of energy, headache, dry lips, tongue or mouth, Lack of sweat, Infrequent urination or no urination whatsoever, dark urine or urine with a strong odor (by day 2, your urine should be close to "clear" if properly hydrated)

Either that or... a visit from the Paramedics, a trip via CareFlight & Emergency Room in Reno in the \$5000 range!

Drink Water! Drink Water! Drink Water! Drink Water!

You may want to consider a [American Med Flight SaveAir](#) Membership to cover any out-of-pocket transportation costs if you have to be [transported Off-Playa](#) for a medical emergency.

New Camper – PolyGuides

Every year we have at ~60 NOOBIES to our camp; many of them are Playa VIRGINS as well. I encourage our veteran campers to assist our VIRGINS in the ways of PolyParadise...

- Camp Placement: Hold fast until Scotto designates a place for you. The boundaries of PP. Be careful about trip hazards.
- Pick up your PolyParadise Resident Tag and wear when using PP facilities.
- Where to put the 5 gallons of drinking water and the location of the drinking water container
- The Placement and Naming of Ice Chests and how to get ice. If melt water is clean, save it for the dishwashing.
- Explain how food is served, how cooking is done and the requirement to clean up after. If you have extra food or beverages, feel free to share them. Cooking for 25 people for one meal is the minimum.
- The coffee machine and its use
- The location and how to use the shower.
- The location of the charging station and proper etiquette [Don't hog, remove when finished etc.]
- The requirement to separate trash and crush recyclables and if leaving early, take a bag of garbage. If you have the room, take several. If you see improper use of trash, please fix it yourself, don't wait for others to do it.
- The PolyP events: Poly High Tea, the Human Carcass Wash, Others... How to volunteer to help
- Explain the camp is here because of the hard work of many volunteers that set it up, keep it running and take it down. Honor them by volunteering yourself, keeping things neat and clean and looking out for others.

Camp Layout

I have **NO IDEA** where within the camp's perimeter any one person(s) will be located. What I do know is where the main structures will be placed, beyond that there is no Pre-Playa plan. Our space is **350'x440'** that is **3.53 acres**.

Please find Scotto before you start to setup your space, it is very important that you find Scotto or the person he has left in charge. There is no Pre-Playa plan, as in you will be placed as you arrive. If many of you arrive in camp at the same time, please be patient with us as we find the best suitable location for you and your gear. The camp is a LARGE puzzle that is pieced together as the week progresses.

If you arrive and Scotto and/or his trusty steed are asleep please take a walk to the Man, relax it is your **Day 1 @ Burning Man**.

A situation may arise where you are asked to adjust the size of your footprint; I expect your understanding & patience. Please be flexible and be willing to compromise on the amount of space you are allotted if I ask.

Community Kitchen - from Page 6

Meals times - **Breakfast: 8a-10a, Lunch 12p-2p, Dinner 6p-8p**, please plan you're cooking & preparation time accordingly. Remember you are cooking for 25. Please be respectful of any events that are in-progress while in the Kitchen/Community area while preparing your meal.

Our kitchen has everything you need to create your dish (Pots & Pans, Stoves, Utensils, Propane, Spices) and just about everything else you need to make an awesome Playa Meal.

You are always welcome to jump right in on cleaning a dirty pots, dishes, and utensils that are just waiting around for someone like you to come along and clean them. Remember the longer they sit the harder they are to clean.

If you cook a meal, then you are responsible for cleaning up.

Community Meals mean you bring something to share. It is not enough just to bring the can of vegetables or fruit, but also to cook or serve what you brought.

Please do not use the Community Kitchen as a drop-off point for food items you brought but will not use. If you had room in your vehicle to bring them to the Playa, you certainly have the room to take them home with you.

Camp Shower

Wet Naked Polyamorous People! Did THAT get your attention? I sure hope so...This from the Department of Yucky Water Stuff...

One of the perks of joining PolyParadise is we provide community shower space for our members and provide safe and ecologically responsible wastewater management.

To reduce the frustration levels all around with Transport, Setup & Maintenance we have decided to invest in an enclosed shower structure. The structure is the same size as a Porto Potty structure but without the Porto part aka a Shower! **You supply the water.**

The system can provide **Hot Water!!** You will pour **YOUR WATER** into a Garbage Can – The water will be pumped into the system. If you pour **5 Gallons** of water into the can you will have **5 Gallons** of water for your shower.



Bring your own water for showering: This is separate from the 5-Gallon water donation per vehicle as your water commitment for camp use (Dishwashing & Starter Water for the Human Carcass Wash). To maintain sanitation and safety standards use only water from unopened containers. Others using the shower will thank you knowing only pure, clean water in the system.

****Make Friends Washing Dishes****

****LEAVE NO TRACE****

****Keep Your Community Space Clean****

Simplified operation, easy-fill transfer container and we will even have lighting for night use.

Anarchy Kamp is on the other side of BRC, so we have to deal with Rules and Regulations. Violations of any of these regulations will be dealt with in the usual, ghastly way.

Clean up after use - We will have a trash sack for soap wrappers and other small stuff. Please do not leave small bars of soap, take them with you or trash them. Keep the shower floor free of any debris even if you didn't drop it.

Please remove your stuff after using the shower. If consumables such as shampoo, conditioner, body wash etc. are left behind they will be considered community property and free use rules apply.

Take your towels and wash cloths when you are done. Take everything your brought to the shower form your space back to your space.

Absolutely **NO** wastewater dumping in the shower. No, dumping of human waste in **ANY** part of our gray water processing system at **ANY** time! Dispose of human waste in the Porto-Potties only. **Do not Pee in the shower.**

The shower is open for operation 24 hours a day. The shower system is for the exclusive use of PolyParadise members only. The public may participate in the Human Carcass Wash experience if they desire.

The community shower may be shut down without prior notice. If conditions warrant, we may close the shower system prior to final shutdown on Monday.

The shower may be closed at any time without notice if conditions warrant as we are at the mercy of the total grey water storage which includes the kitchen and anticipation of an on-time Servicing on that day; shit happens on-playa – just be prepared that when the shower was the only thing that was going to save your bad playa day; it might be closed.

Volunteerism is important; it is the purest sense of giving. When you give freely with no guarantee of compensation...The reward is the journey itself.

Gray Water Reclamation

Over the years, we have experimented with various ways to handle our Gray Water. Gray water is defined as water from human activities not including human or other body waste. This includes dishwashing, showers etc.

Black water is defined as water that includes human or other body waste. This includes poop, pee, blood and that "other stuff." At no time will PolyParadise process black water. Burning Man has provided Porto-Potties for such disposal.

Our gray water will be from the following four sources:
Kitchen dishwater - Community Shower - Human Carcass Wash - Camper generated from individual cooking.

We are estimating the following volumes from each source:
Kitchen- 50GpD - Shower- 50 GpD - Human Carcass Wash- 10 GpD - Other- 20 GpD - Total 180 GpD

Our methods evolved from Treating & Filtering to Evaporation, with each passing year learning what works & what does not work. The stumbling blocks we experience is the sheer volume of water generated during the week that must be evaporated.

For this and many other reasons in 2024 PolyParadise will be contracting with an outside company to Deliver & Service (4)-250G Holding Tanks for Gray Water Collection. (3) PolyParadise (1) Twisted Swan|Temple of Bacchus. Including Pre-Paid RV Service vouchers, the total cost is \$7,638 + Driver Tip. Delivery is scheduled for 8/22; with servicing during the week.

Consider Pre-Cooking portions of your meal if possible. The [Food Saver](#) will create an awesome storage container for your meal. (Freeze Liquids before Sealing)

Having holding tanks within camp for our Gray Water Disposal does not mean we do not care about Water Conservation, in-fact, it will make us more aware of the volume of water we produce as a camp.

Dishwashing Water will be collected at the sink and screened for particulate matter before the Holding Tank. There will be available to assist in dishwashing Biodegradable-Mother Earth Friendly Soap (Camp suds).

All materials not suited for the Holding Tank will be collected in 5-Gallon sealable buckets for Off-Playa transportation & disposal.

Shower Water - There will be one main camp shower available to all campers. **You supply the water.** All shower water drainage will be collected and transported to the Holding Tank. Do not Pee in the shower.

The shower water collection area should never be used for Gray Water Disposal. Do not urinate or empty personal pee containers into our Gray Water system, please use the Porto-Potties.

Human Carcass Wash - Gray Water Collection - In running the HCW the participants stand in plastic troughs to catch the water and particulate matter washed from bodies. If this water has not evaporated, it can be dumped directly into the Gray Water Tanks. HCW crew must be diligent to ensure that no foreign matter such as plastic, jewelry or other MOOP gets dumped into the system.

Community Trash

Trash is a problem. We all generate trash. We all need to be a responsible for it.

Each vehicle that arrives at PolyParadise will be required to take home **at least two bags of trash**. Towards the end of the week, the TRASH crew will place the bags of trash at the driver's side door of your vehicle (think of it like SANTA). These are YOUR bags to take home. It will be DOUBLE BAGGED, NON-STINKY, and of REASONABLE size and flexibility for packing. Please plan room in your vehicle for these bags of trash.

If for any reason, you don't like your bag of trash (you just don't click or cannot get along with one another) please see the **TRASH Crew** for an exchange of bags.

It is your responsibility to dispose of your bag properly. The best place for this would be at home. But if you cannot take your bag home, here are some alternative places you can rid yourself of your bag. Remember we don't take glass in the trash. It is a hazard to handle...You had room to bring it to BRC you have room to take it back home.

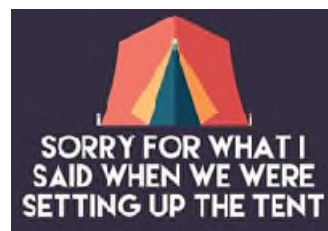

PolyParadise **SALUTES & THANKS Max Flynn and his Ice Taxi** for years of making the vehicle available to us as a camp to make a large Daily Ice run to Artica. For 2024 Artica ice prices for **16 lb. cracked \$12 & 7 lb. block ice are \$7**. 2024 prices have yet to be released.

We do not have a dedicated Ice Czar/Lead this year; each day an Ice Team will be randomly assigned with our working model [Volunteeratoldism™](#). The Team will assemble between 9a-10a & take our **New Ice Carts** & go to Artica and purchase the Ice and return to camp and place the Ice in designated coolers within our kitchen space.

The camp budget will cover the first day Ice Purchase. A bucket will be provided for you to deposit your \$\$ on a per Bag Cost that you take from the cooler. *This will be on the honor system*; if you take Ice and do not put \$\$ in the bucket you are hurting our entire camp. Each days Money put into the bucket replenishes the supply of the same number of bags purchased. We will not be making change.

If you want ice you should be **In Camp** to receive the ice when it arrives as it is on a **First-Come First-Serve basis**. You can go a purchase ice on your own @ a nearby Artica location.

*Ice is sold at Arctica in Center Camp, in the 3 & 9 plazas on G. Mon to Sat hrs are 9a to 6p, Sun noon to 6p | Exodus Monday in Center Camp only 9a to noon. **Pre-event**, ice is available at Center Camp Arctica Thursday-Sunday Noon-6p & Ice-9. Saturday - Sunday noon to 6p. You can pay with Credit Card or Apple Pay and or Cash.*

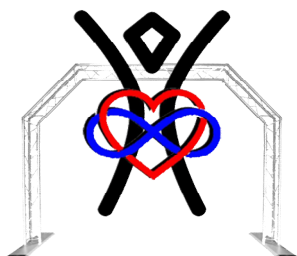

Health & Safety

Stay healthy and safe while you explore the many opportunities for participation at Burning Man! Here is some information you need to keep yourself healthy, and tell you where to find emergency services, should you need them.

Remember Radical Self-Reliance! Bring a first aid kit and any medications you may need (the closest pharmacies are in Fernley or Reno, and there is no clinic in Gerlach).

Should your illness or injury be more severe than you can manage without help, there are **Emergency Services** medical stations on the **3:00 and 9:00 plazas**, on the **Esplanade at 5:15**, and new stations on the plazas at **4:30 and 7:30**, and out between the Man and the Temple. All stations are identifiable by a red cross on top of the buildings. The stations are staffed by emergency health care providers (doctors, nurses, medics, etc.) who donate their time and medical expertise to the city as their gift to us all.

If you require a higher level of care than cannot be provided on the playa, you will need to visit a hospital in Reno, either by getting a ride from a friend, or being transported by an ambulance, plane, or helicopter (depending on your condition). If you are able, request to sign a "Consent to Release Information" form so we can tell your friends and family where you are and what happened (by law, we can't provide information about you without your consent). Bring your ID, insurance card, cell phone, and wallet when you go. If you get transported by ambulance, plane, or helicopter, you'll need to arrange for a friend to pick you up after your care. There are no shuttles from the hospitals back to the playa.

Rebar Safety

Each year most of the injuries at Burning Man can be traced to collisions with rebar. These steel rods work well because they are cheap and hold up against the playa winds better than standard-issue tent stakes.

Most rebar injuries result from stubbing a toe, piercing a foot or otherwise impaling a body part on the exposed metal. Injuries generally happen at times of low visibility, such as in the dark and massive dust storms.

The solution? Covering the exposed end of the rebar with a tennis ball, doll head, plastic bottle or other padding will help prevent injuries is a step in the right direction, but the best way to prevent injury is to **HAMMER THAT SUCKER ALL THE WAY IN!** However, before doing so, you must make sure you are equipped to pull it out again.



The radicalness of it is not that it is offensive or edgy or in your face-shocking - The radicalness of it is that it is coming straight out of your heart and it is going public, where else do you get that chance.

YOUR COOLER – DAY 1

When you pack for your trip to BRC - your cooler should be **ICED** - When you are at the last stop on Rt. 80 (From the West (Sparks) - From the East (Fernley) before making the turn on HYW 447 heading towards Gerlach - **YOUR COOLER SHOULD BE ICED!!** When you arrive @ Burning Man your cooler should have **ICE** maybe somewhat melted, but it should **HAVE ICE!!!**

As a Village of 300 persons, we are required to have a Health Permit by the Nevada Health Dept. The Health Dept will visit our camp and make sure that we are adhering to all prescribed food preparation - serving - cleanup requirements.

In 2023 WE DID GREAT WITH THE PREPARATION - SERVING - CLEANUP.

The Nevada Health Dept will inspect all coolers and make sure that the contents of said cooler are at proper temperature. Obviously, coolers that have **NO ICE or LIMITED ICE** cannot possibly be at proper temperature. The contents of any cooler not cooled to proper temperature were **DISCARDED!**

WE HIGHLY ENCOURAGE - NO WE REQUIRE that you ICE DOWN YOUR COOLERS as you start your trip to the Playa and KEEP ICE LEVEL IN COOLERS AS REQUIRED during your trip.

This will ensure that when you cook your meal that **NO ONE EATING YOUR FOOD WILL GET SICK!**

We will also be more proactive and do an **ICE RUN on Sunday (Day 1)** that any camper can use to make sure that when you arrive On-Playa that your cooler can be **RE-ICED** and your food can be kept to temperature and **KEPT SAFE FOR EATING!!**

ULTIMATELY KEEPING YOUR COOLER ICED - YOUR FOOD SAFE ON THE WAY TO BRC IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

During the event you can order **ICE** in conjunction with our **ICE - ICE - Daily ICE - SEE PAGE 14**



Burner Express Bus

For those that travel to Burning Man on the [Burner Express Bus](#) Check the FAQ for all Ticketing & restrictions on what you can & cannot bring on the bus aka "Amount of Gear Limits".

You will be given a **Burner Express Trash Bag** – Make sure to bring that Trash Bag to the **Trash Area** and fill it properly with Community Trash that you can transport back on the Burner Express as you leave Burning Man.

From the Garbage Dump

Since Burning Man is a Leave No Trace event, all the garbage we produce needs to go back home with us. There is no place to leave it on the Playa.

Therefore, starting on Saturday & Sunday your very own PolyParadise garbage will show up next to the driver's side door of your vehicle delivered by the [Volunteeratoldism™](#) crew. These are your very own bag(s) of trash to take off the playa and dispose of responsibly. We will do everything we can to make sure that these bags are not over-stuffed. They will be double bagged & taped to avoid any leakage.

To help facilitate the whole process of garbage handling there are things you can do, as a responsible PolyParadise Camper that will make the job easier.

Try your best to drop your trash into the appropriate bin. There will be labeled bins for **TRASH, RECYCLE, GLASS and BURNABLES**. Crush plastic containers. Crush cans with the provided crusher.

If you are keeping a separate trash container in your tent, take it with you. Bringing it to the camp trash at the end of the week just means that someone else will need to carry it away.

GLASS – There will be specific BAGS for GLASS – these bags are made so that broken GLASS will not rip/tear said bags.

On Monday, the trash area will officially close – There won't be an announcement of when. The Kitchen is the first to come down Monday TEARDOWN DAY! If you haven't gotten rid of it by now you need to take it home with you.

Anyone who can take MORE than two bags of trash, Campers who take additional bags of trash off-playa have a special place in our community's heart.

Remember, any trash that doesn't go home with you, has to go on the truck. And there isn't much spare room on the truck for trash.

Don't bring garbage to the playa.

Remove as much of the packing material as you can from ANYTHING you bring to the playa. Get rid of the cereal box and just bring the inner bag. Get rid of the plastic rings on the 6 pack of beer. Unwrap the individual snack bars from the plastic bag.

If you are just going to throw it out on the playa... then it should not come out in the first place.

Each Vehicle is required to take 2 bags of trash off the playa with you.



That's right... There is no trash pick-up at Burning Man. The trash we generate is the trash we must take off the playa. Each Vehicle will be required to take **2 bags of trash** off the playa. **PLAN FOR THIS WHEN YOU ARE PACKING.**

One helpful hint: If you have planned your food correctly, there will be empty space in your cooler where you can store some of your camping equipment (sleeping bag, mattress, camelback) to make room for the trash you need to take away.

There are plenty of opportunities to get rid of your trash on the drive home. **See Community Trash Page 11.** Many of the Indian Tribes provide opportunities on Rt. 447 to deposit your trash for a \$/Bag Fee.

Your trash will show up next to your vehicle sometime Saturday/Sunday. **DON'T LEAVE IT BEHIND OR WE WILL HUNT YOU DOWN.**

25/26th Year Anniversary Art

HOLY SHNICKIES BATMAN!!! We are **CELEBRATING 26 YEARS** in **Black Rock City**. Huge shoutout to **Touch** (*The inventor of the Human Carcass Wash*) our only remaining member from the original iteration of PolyParadise in **1999**.

In **1999** PolyParadise was **8** campers. In **2000**, my first year we were **15** campers. In **2004**; Wildchild's 1st year we were **65** campers. It was **2010** that was the first year we had over **100** campers. In **2014** we topped **200** and for the past **10 Yrs** we have been avg **~260** campers within PolyParadise.

In **2003-2005** PolyParadise anchored **Shangri-La Village** which was a collaboration of several San Diego based camps.

In **2013-2015** we welcomed the **9 Energies** within our borders.

Huge shoutout to **Duncan & Kilted Freedom (In Memorial)** who originally purchased the former **Dusty Swan** theme camp then rebranded as the **Twisted Swan** have been part of our Village since **2014**.

MAJOR KUDOS to **Guami** who took over as lead of **The Twisted Swan** in **2017** as well as leads the **Temple of Bacchus** theme camp. I have to say that it is incredible to have a BAR as part of the Village aka literally stumbling distance from your Tent or RV.

Over the **26 YRS** we have hosted **hundreds** of **international** campers from **34** countries.



WOW JUST FREAKIN WOW!!!! HOLY SHNICKIES BATMAN!!! We are **CELEBRATING 26 YEARS** in **Black Rock City!!!**

The **Five (5) in 25** and the **Three (3) in 2023** have been replaced to make it **26 YRS and 2024**.

Food Prep Tips

Tear away all the unneeded packaging you can before you pack for your trip to Burning Man, so that you can shrink the size of your kit/bundle/stuff. Recycle those bits *before* you come, and you won't need to deal with them. Use Tupperware or other sealable that don't become trash afterwards where possible. You may also consider buying items with less packaging as a matter of principle. Wash veggies, if possible, before you arrive.

Take spices in those 7-day pill minders. Works great and they seal shut and take no space. Put your name on them with a Sharpie. **If you need refrigeration for meds, make sure to ask one of our campers with an RV, I am sure they would not mind storing these for you.**

Try and measure things so that there are no leftovers unless you'll actually eat them. Leftovers seasoned with Playa are even less appetizing. Leftover organics are difficult and smelly to dispose of.

Don't fool yourself into believing that you can live on granola bars at Burning Man. You need balanced nutrition like you've never needed it before in the desert, as you're often expending huge amounts of energy and won't realize it. You need greens, protein, as well as carbs, and tons of water (and perhaps other liquids).

Making Meals for 25: Generally, you can take a recipe for 4 and multiply it by six (adding a dash here and there) to make a meal for 25.

Budget your time accordingly. We're a very patient bunch, and you'll make many people happy, as you will when you chow down on exquisite desert-made cuisine.

Salads can be easily extended by putting good things in them, like nuts (unsalted but roasted, generally-- always in a dish on the side for those that have nut allergies), raisins, cranberry-raisins/craisins, chopped veggies (carrots, celery, bell peppers, cherry/grape tomatoes), small fruits (grapes, cherries, kiwi, etc.) and the like. Dressings can be made from simple oil/vinegar combinations (try various oil and vinegar flavors), and crouton-like bits. Avoid putting things together; let people assemble their own combinations. Remember to set things up for easy clean-up and/or re-use (although re-use is more difficult due to the dust).

There will be **Index Cards – Place Holders – Pencils** for you to write down & display what you have cooked so those in the serving line know what they might be eating or how it was prepared or what ingredients are included.

If you KNOW that your offering is vegan, please label it so. Vegetarian is a loose definition, but usually means no meat products, but might include dairy. Chicken (and for many, eggs) and fish aren't vegetarian, along with certain meat by-products like marshmallows, cheese made with animal rennet, and the like. Please label accordingly if you're sharing.

If you take medication that requires refrigeration, ask a fellow camper with an RV if they might be able to store it for you. Let them know what kind of access you will need to it.

Enjoy the snacks; they're usually nutritious and their variety can please many tastes. Snack wrappers create MOOP if not recycled promptly. Snacks aren't for nutrition, generally, they're good only for short-term energy. Don't consider them food.

There's lots of food available elsewhere on the playa. There are a lot of foods given as gifts, and camps that specialize in this. Remember to bring your own cup, plate, napkins/serviettes, and cutlery with you-- and something to clean your hands as well as the aforementioned items- in your backpack/camelback.

Food Sources near Black Rock City

Depending on your politics, [Wal-Mart](#) can do a lot for you. There are lots of them, several in Reno/Sparks, one in Fernley, and in Winnemucca NV. There's a huge [Trader Joe's](#) on the south side of Reno; very well stocked and full of burners.

Once you've turned onto RT. 447 North of Fernley, the pickings are impossibly thin, except for some roadside Indian Taco stands. Wadsworth, Nixon, Empire, and Gerlach all have small stores; you're on your own. Planning will help you; shop in Reno/Sparks, Fernley, Lovelock, or Winnemucca before you hit NV 447 to Gerlach and the Burn.

Radical Self-Reliance is a hallmark of the event. That doesn't mean you're totally stranded, but it does mean that the others around you, while inclusive and generous, also have brought what they needed, and must leave with no trace.

Camp Laptop | Movies

There will be a Community Laptops/Stereos in the Community Space & the Event Space.; the primary function of these devices will be to interface with the Stereo to provide a continuous (if desired) stream of **Techno – Rock – Reggae – 100Gigs** as a matter of fact. There should be WiFi available provided by The Twisted Swan – The Camp WiFi will require a password and should not be shared | But there are no guarantees, as this is Burning Man.

Each night we will have **MOVIES** being shown in the Community Space. We have an awesome selection of the finest movies for your enjoyment pleasure.

Playa Tips

Foot Care: *Playa foot* - is a malady unique to the Black Rock Desert caused by the alkali dust that makes up the desert. It is, in essence, a chemical burn. The most common cause of playa foot is exposure of your feet to the desert floor by not wearing socks and closed shoes.

Wash your feet well to remove all the playa dust that is embedded in the cracks of your skin. This may require soaking them in a basin of water. Many people recommend adding a small amount of vinegar to the water to neutralize the alkali. 1/4 vinegar and 3/4 water is a good mix. After washing your feet, dry them well and look to make sure you have gotten all the playa dust off of them. If available, apply a thin layer of antibiotic ointment or lotion to the soles of your feet. This isn't necessary and should only be done if you can keep your feet covered with socks and shoes or boots.

Keep your feet covered with socks and closed shoes or boots. Failure to do so will only allow your feet to get worse from the accumulation of more dust on your feet.

Nose Care: Saline or w/aloe nasal spray. Especially if you are use to a more humid climate. Dried out nasal passages can hurt and bleed.

*Take care of your Feet...
Your Feet will take care of YOU!!*

Lip Care: lip balm with sunscreen, preferably hung from a lanyard so you always have it at the ready.... whether you have pockets or not.

General Stuff: A set of clothing including shoes/sandals that stays in zip lock bags until after tearing down camp, to change into for the ride home.

Mask for windstorms, Small sized Sanitizing gel (alcohol) to keep in your pocket. Good to use after a trip to the Porto Potties. Camelback or similar (for portable hydration). A reusable mug or cup for coffee and beverages at the Center Camp Café. Contact Lenses: (Bring a back-up pair. Then bring a back-up pair for the back-up pair)

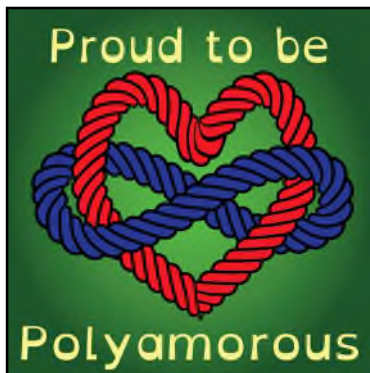
Medical Alert Bracelets: Black Rock City's [Emergency Services Department](#) highly encourages folks who normally wear a medic alert bracelet to do so on playa as well. If you don't usually wear a medic alert bracelet but have a serious medical condition, we encourage you to wear one on playa to ensure Emergency staff can take appropriate care of you. Questions? Remember: Anything that you bring to the Playa & PolyParadise is yours to take back home. Please do not leave your unwanted food, infrastructure, or garbage for me to take home to Phoenix.



How much water should I bring? You are responsible for bringing **Five (5) Gallons** of water/vehicle to donate to the Camp. This water will be used for starter water each day for the Human Carcass Wash and will also fill a Community Water jug for all to use. This bright orange cooler will be in the Community Space and will have blocks of ice dropped in each day so that there is always cold water to enjoy for all campers.

You also need to plan for water you will personally use during the week. Plan on **1.5 Gallons/Person/Day** for drinking, your consumption may vary.

It is also your responsibility to bring your own shower water. We supply the shower you supply the water. If you pour 5 Gallons of water into the container; you would get a **5-Minute** shower. If you want a longer shower have more water available

So, if you plan to take one shower/day and you are there for 7 days you would need ~30 Gallons of water for showers.

The best transport for your water is the Arrowhead or similar brand 5-gallon suitcases, they pack & carry the easiest.

Remember, water weighs **8 lbs./Gallon**, so you might want to wait to purchase your water in Reno or Fernley and not transport the water from your home destination to save weight and gas mileage.

The definition of community is a place where there is gift exchange. The converse of that would be; if you wish to destroy community, a good way to do it is to turn all gift giving into commercial exchanges.

Water and Plastic Waste

Everyone has to bring water to the playa. Try to buy your water in the largest sizes you can find. 5-gallon containers are great. 2-gallon containers are ok. 1-gallon containers are barely acceptable. Avoid as much as possible cases of "single serving" water bottles.

- These are wrapped in plastic and cardboard, which is garbage before it even arrives.
- Water bottles end up all over camp – half-drunk – with no names on them, and who the heck is going to finish someone else's half-drunk water.

These are **WASTE**, all the way around.

Our camp has a water cooler that refilled with ice each day. **BRING A PLASTIC WATER BOTTLE AND FILL IT UP FROM THE COOLER.** This will greatly reduce one of the worst forms of waste. Re-use! Re-use! Re-use!

Burning Man does not provide a space to Burn Trash. As a result, it is even MORE imperative that you think about reducing the amount of paper trash you bring to the playa.

If you had room to bring it, you have room to take it home.

In the past, people have left broken chairs behind as garbage, as if **YOUR** broken chair was the **CAMP's** problem. **No. No. No.**

In the past, people would leave unused water as a "gift" for the camp. Which meant that someone else had to pour it out and deal with the plastic waste. **No. No. No.**

In the past, people would keep trash in their tent, and at the last minute, bring it out to the trash area, as if suddenly your personal trash became community trash. **No. No. No.**

Whatever "**personal**" trash you end up with is yours to handle. Broken chairs, tents, bikes, and personal trash don't suddenly become everyone else's problem. You had room to bring it out, you have room to take it home.

With some fore thought, we can reduce the amount of trash that we all need to deal with before anyone leaves the playa. I appreciate all your efforts, and I especially appreciate those that pitch in and those who manage to take MORE than the minimum # of Trash Bags Off-Playa



Sense of Community

We are a community and the way PolyParadise continues to be a community is through the efforts of all of YOU!

Burning Man is based on Radical Self-Reliance, as a community at Burning Man this does not change, except for the infrastructure that is provided. It is still up to all of us to make the PolyParadise community be successful. It takes all of us together to put the structure together, maintain it on a daily basis.

What you need to contribute towards our community is:

- **5 Gallons of Water/Vehicle** - Running of the Human Carcass Wash / Community Drinking water.
- **Take At Least Two (2) Bags** of Community Garbage Off-Playa - Be responsible and dispose of this garbage in appropriate receptacles.
- Follow the **LEAVE NO TRACE** rule of BRC, and coordinate with other camp members prior to leaving the event and our campsite looking for and picking up MOOP (Matter Out of Place)
- Participate in one mandatory meal prep/serve/clean a (Providing a meal for 25)

Meals are not included in the \$325/person Camp Fee. Meals are a gift the community gives to itself. Again, this is radical self-reliance it is not up to the community to feed you, and it is up to all of us to contribute together.

Even if it is not your scheduled turn to cook...adding a small side dish can add to any meal. It can be as small as chips and salsa, canned fruit, a salad, anything you want to share with the group. The more you share without being asked the more there is for everyone.

Personal Coolers can be stored in the designated area at the back of the kitchen so you can have easier access to your items, and you do not have to store them in a hot tent. Please put your name on your cooler and respect another person's property. Ice for personal coolers is the responsibility of the individual.

A Large container of Cold Drinking water will always be available in the community area.

The Ten Principles of Burning Man

This is the 20 YEAR Anniversary of the Ten (10) Principles

** Read Them - Re-Read Them – Repeat Them 5x – Live Them **

Let them guide you in your daily life - Spread the Word!!!

Burning Man Founder [Larry Harvey](#) wrote the Ten Principles in 2004 as guidelines for the newly formed Regionals Network. They were crafted not as a dictate of how people should be and act, but as a reflection of the community's ethos and culture as it had organically developed since the event's inception.

Radical Inclusion - Anyone may be a part of Burning Man. We welcome and respect the stranger. No prerequisites exist for participation in our community.

Gifting - Burning Man is devoted to acts of gift giving. The value of a gift is unconditional. Gifting does not contemplate a return or an exchange for something of equal value.

Decommodification - In order to preserve the spirit of gifting, our community seeks to create social environments that are unmediated by commercial sponsorships, transactions, or advertising. We stand ready to protect our culture from such exploitation. We resist the substitution of consumption for participatory experience.

Radical Self-reliance - Burning Man encourages the individual to discover, exercise and rely on his or her inner resources.

Radical Self-expression - Radical self-expression arises from the unique gifts of the individual. No one other than the individual or a collaborating group can determine its content. It is offered as a gift to others. In this spirit, the giver should respect the rights and liberties of the recipient.

Communal Effort - Our community values creative cooperation and collaboration. We strive to produce, promote and protect social networks, public spaces, works of art, and methods of communication that support such interaction.

Civic Responsibility - We value civil society. Community members who organize events should assume responsibility for public welfare and endeavor to communicate civic responsibilities to participants. They must also assume responsibility for conducting events in accordance with local, state and federal laws.

Leaving No Trace - Our community respects the environment. We are committed to leaving no physical trace of our activities wherever we gather. We clean up after ourselves and endeavor, whenever possible, to leave such places in a better state than when we found them.

Participation - Our community is committed to a radically participatory ethic. We believe that transformative change, whether in the individual or in society, can occur only through the medium of deeply personal participation. We achieve being through doing. Everyone is invited to work. Everyone is invited to play. We make the world real through actions that open the heart.

Immediacy - Immediate experience is, in many ways, the most important touchstone of value in our culture. We seek to overcome barriers that stand between us and a recognition of our inner selves, the reality of those around us, participation in society, and contact with a natural world exceeding human powers. No idea can substitute for this experience.

THE VILLAGE OF POLY PARADISE CONSENT POLICY

We believe authentic and enthusiastic Consent is the 11th Principle of *Burning Man*. We believe we can show people how to express themselves by normalizing the conversation surrounding Consent.

When our community feels as comfortable discussing Consent as they do discussing food, everyone will benefit. We believe that Consent works best when discussed up front. By having the conversation before anybody steps foot on the playa we foster trust and understanding so that everyone can be

- **Safe to explore—sexually and otherwise**
- **Confident about expressing boundaries**
- **Empowered to speak up**
- **Conditioned to hearing “no” and thank people for taking care of themselves**

Affirmative Consent for any Participation (touching, hugging, dancing, photos, etc.) is required from everyone within our camp. Without an authentic, freely given, specific, informed, and enthusiastic “YES”, there is no consent.

Consent is always reversible and retractable at any time. Violations of an individual’s boundaries will result in a Teachable Moment to learn how to change the behavior, or removal from the camp with the potential to not be welcomed to return.

Tier 1: "Hey! How's it going?"

The point of the "Hey! How's it going?" is an unassuming way to get more information by not be a bystander. Any Consent Ambassador can execute this step.

Our **Camp Leads** are tasked with handling escalations reported to them after campmates have practiced this step themselves, or feel they were not able to deliver this step themselves. When an incident is escalated to our leads, they approach the parties for more information. This is done by conversing with the parties involved to get their sides. Move to the Teachable Moment.

Tier 2: The Teachable Moment

The Teachable Moment is verbally stating our boundaries. Any Consent Ambassador can execute this for themselves or another burner, and we encourage you to seek help if you do not have the capacity to do this step alone.

When help is sought, the Capable Individual mediates the Teachable Moment by seeking a clear, verbalized boundary with as many of the burners involved as possible; together or separately. Verbalizing the boundary draws a line in the sand that gives an opportunity to learn our culture and change the behavior. Repeated instances could result in a temporary or permanent ban.

Tier 3: Removal

If a Teachable Moment needs to be repeated, or there's a complex incident regarding any of the 11 Principles, then the **Camp Leads** are tasked with collaborating on disciplinary action. Our minds are greater as a group, and our capacity to solve problems is supported when we have more minds together. It's understood not all of the **Camp Leads** may be present at any given time. Still, any capably-minded **Camp Leads** are to participate in contemplating and voting upon disciplinary action including temporary or permanent bans during and/or after the event.

Temporary Ban

A temporary ban can apply to a campmate or guests for varying reasons (over-intoxication, multiple Teachable Moments, intentionally disregarding our principles, being a complete dick, etc...) Anyone in camp with a leadership title, which applies to **Camp Leads**, **Camp Conduct Lead**, **LNT Lead**, **Kitchen Lead**, or other **Camp Leads**, can temporarily remove these individuals. Rangers are our next resource with the necessary tools to radio for assistance if needed.

Permanent Ban

A permanent ban must be so severe that a campmate or guest is no longer welcome in our camp again. This **MUST** go through our **Camp Leads** who are Approved to Remove so a vote on the disciplinary action can happen. If the complaint is about a **Camp Leads**, the **Camp Conduct Lead**, being the voice of the camp, will address the issue with **Camp Leads** not named to reduce power dynamics. Participation of camp activities and/or leadership is suspended until a vote has been passed once this Consent Enforcement Process has been executed.

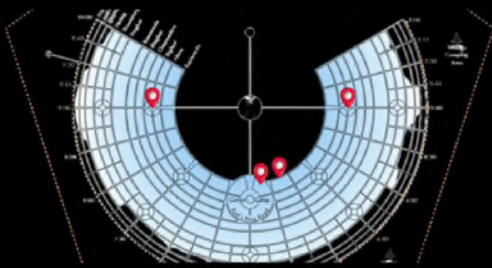

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Look for the lit red cross and the heroes in yellow shirts. They provide Black Rock City with firefighting, emergency medical, and crisis intervention services. Emergency Services are not part of any law enforcement or outside agency. **They are also located at 5:15 & Esplanade.**

ZENDO

If you're feeling overwhelmed, having an intense trip, or in need of harm reduction services, trained peer support- volunteers from the Zendo Project and the Green Dot team are there to help you through your stress.

BLACK ROCK RANGERS

Look for the khaki-colored clothing roaming around the playa. Rangers help mediate disagreements, address safety concerns, and find lost kids. They are not law enforcement, but they can radio for them. **They are also located at 5:45 & Esplanade.**

NO TOUCHING! S.A.T. TEAM

If someone comes to you with a sexual assault allegation, **do not touch them** unless they ask. Let them know they are strong and be an ear for support. The survivor makes the final decision on if they want to report.

The Survival Advocacy Team is located next to Medical on 5:15 & Esplanade (Station 6), where you can file a report in a secluded area. Sexual assaults are considered a must-report among staff. You can also report at any Medical Station or Ranger Outpost. Remember 9/3/C!

RAPE KITS

Survivors are flown to Reno for an examination, where they will get a room, hot shower, change of clothes, and meals accommodated.

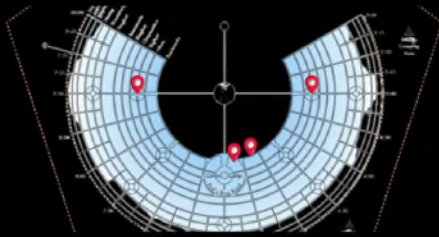
